

Meet the Board of Directors


























Key Student Experience Impacts



The Advocacy Impact

Advocacy Impact at a glance:

- 3,185 Year-End Survey Responses (a 7.8% turnout)
- 9,463 GRT Referendum Votes (a 26.14% voter turnout)
- 735 students were provided with Academic Appeal information and 267 meetings with Student Advocates
- 65 Student Advisory Committee Members
- 15 Indigenous Circle members
- 415 Interactions at Advocacy Awareness Booths

Advocacy Awareness Booths

Created in Spring 2023, our Advocacy Awareness Booths generated awareness of CSI's Advocacy department and services. Through these booths, students were educated on the CSI Year-End Survey, the Student Living Guide, Student Advocates & Academic Appeal Support, Student Advisory Committees, the Indigenous Circle, and other advocacy efforts like the Copyright Campaign and GRT U-Pass Referendum.

CASA Copyright Campaign

The CASA Copyright Campaign responded to publishers' and writers' advocacy to reverse the government's 2012 decision to include education as a category of Fair Dealing under the Copyright Modernization Act by gathering student feedback and sharing it with The House of Commons. Before the Copyright Modernization Act, students experienced an 800% increase in textbook pricing over 30-years leading up to the Copyright Modernization Act (Canadian Alliance of Student Associations, 2023).

CSI's Advocacy and Marketing departments successfully hosted a 3-week long campaign, engaging over 335 students across 7 Conestoga College campuses:


- 6 Conestoga students created videos for CASA's social media campaign about Fair Dealing
- 335 students stopped by our hallway booths to learn about the benefits of keeping education a category of Fair Dealing
- 196 students wrote and mailed empowering postcards advocating for their needs to the Members of Parliament

Student Advisory Committees

CSI's Student Advisory Committees (or SAC) consisted of 65 active student members in 2023/2024. These committees provide feedback on various aspects of the student experience such as transportation, housing, and food security. A few key highlights of the year include:

- In Spring 2023, The Housing SAC, alongside CSI's President and Vice President, discussed the impacts of the recommendations from the Lower Doon Land Use Study, reviewed the definitions of zoning areas, and examined the draft of the land use map for Lower Doon.
- The Housing SAC talked about the increasing rates of homelessness amongst students, particularly international students, with the Waterloo Region Social Development Centre.
- The Transportation SAC continuously provided feedback to CSI's Advocacy Department to help ensure the GRT U-Pass Campaign was accessible to all students in Spring 2023.

- The Transportation SAC also shared insights regarding the accessibility of information to students during the strike of Unifor Local 4304 who represent GRT workers in May of 2023.
- During the Fall 2023 Semester, All SACs contributed to CSI's 2024 Pre-Budget Submission to the Government of Ontario.





Student Advocates Program

Going through an academic appeal alone can be stressful and confusing, but it became easier with the launch of the Student Advocates Program! In March 2023, CSI launched the Student Advocates Program to provide a peer-to-peer service that supports students with their academic appeals by helping them understand the procedure, timelines, and other important considerations to make it as simple as possible.

- 735 students received personalized support through the appeals process
- **267** one-on-one meetings were held with students and student advocates

Improving Food Security

After completing CSI's Food Security Survey in Winter 2023, we learned that the majority of students were facing food security challenges, and it became evident that a broader, more collaborative approach needed to be taken to address student food insecurity at Conestoga College.

In August 2023, CSI and Conestoga collaboratively launched the Food Security Collective to develop a series of evidenceinformed initiatives and recommendations to:

- Increase access to sustainable and nutritious food options
- Decrease the demand on external community resources outside of Conestoga College
- Develop centralized communications for food support
- Build and maintain meaningful collaborative partnerships

Since the launch, 24 initiatives and recommendations have been developed, and more are being explored for implementation to address food security for students!



Indigeneity at CSI

Conestoga's Indigenous Circle is comprised of 15 members consisting of current students, alumni, CSI team members, and Be-Dah-Bin Gamik representatives who collaborate to create Indigenous-centric programming to educate, allocate resources, offer skills development opportunities, and foster respectful connections to support a holistic student experience. This year, the impacts of the Indigenous Circle include:

- The Advocacy Research Coordinator created and discussed the Indigenous Identity Brief in response to false Indigenous Identity claims raised by the Indigenous Circle
- Hosted various educational events surrounding settler knowledge and culturally significant dates such as a Residential School Tour on National Day of Truth, a red dress installation on Doon, Cambridge, DTK, and Waterloo campuses for National Day of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, and a special event featuring Indigenous-owned Cheekbone Beauty entrepreneur, Jenn Harper
- Cultivated events and activities for Indigenous and settler students to connect and/or learn about Indigenous cultures like a Fry Bread Making workshop and putting on a 'Reservation Dogs' movie showing
- Supporting Be-Dah-Bin Gamik (Indigenous Services) events and activities such as Pow Wow and Indigenous Music Festival



Housing

CSI advocated to all levels of government this past year on a variety of housing issues, including:

- Increasing housing availability, particularly in the Lower Doon area surrounding the Doon campus
- Rental licensing in all municipalities home to a Conestoga College campus
- Comprehensive inclusionary zoning in the Waterloo Region to address both housing supply and affordability

- Allowing additional dwelling units (up to four) as a right in the majority of municipalities with a Conestoga College Campus
- Increasing tenant rights and responsibilities resources.

CSI also worked with Conestoga College to share student voices regarding what improvements need to be made for new student residence developments – prioritizing the need for affordable living options.

CSI and the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA) successfully advocated to the federal government to allow developers and post-secondary institutions access to more funding for building student residences.

CSI continues to support students experiencing housing crises by connecting them with local and college services and resources.



Local Transit Improvements

Throughout the last year, CSI advocated for many improvements to local transit routes across all campuses, with some major commitments and improvements made, including:

Grand River Transit (GRT)

- An increase of 18,000 service hours in September 2023 by GRT, focusing on improving transit in Cambridge.
- Increased frequency of Routes 8 and 12 between Waterloo and Kitchener from every 30 minutes to every 15 minutes.
- 33,000 increased service hours for many routes directly servicing Conestoga College campuses implemented throughout 2024, and an additional 7,000 hours to reduce overcrowding.
- The introduction of Route 72 to Reuter Campus starting September 1, 2024.

Brantford Transit


- A planned overhaul of Brantford Transit's route network to increase route frequencies and provide extended service hours.
- Intentions to introduce a new fare model with an extremely affordable U-Pass, supported by feedback collected from 321 survey respondents and 82 in-person student engagements at the Brantford Campus.

Guelph Transit

- Ensure Conestoga students receive the same or improved level of transit services by halting service cuts and delays from Guelph Transit due to budget constraints.
- Transition to a more equitable fare-capping model until a formal Universal Transit Pass (U-Pass) referendum can be hosted.

Milton Transit

- Working with Milton Transit and Conestoga College to implement Route 1, servicing Milton Campus.
- Provide a discounted student pass rate and explore future transit partnerships.



Raising Student Issues

Sometimes, improving the student experience requires action outside of the College from the government. To make this happen, it's important for CSI to have strong relationships with our local officials and to actively participate in government processes, consultations, and discussions. Over the last year, CSI engaged in:

- Presenting to the Standing Committee on Social Policy for opportunities to improve mental health, anti-racism, and fee transparency.
- Participating in the 2024 Provincial Budget Process by presenting to the Minister of Finance and submitting our requests for improvements to post-secondary funding for institutions and student aid, improving financial and housing security, and improving interregional transportation.
- Meeting with local officials to discuss student mental health, student housing, food and housing insecurity, and more.



Improving the Academic Appeals Process

CSI continues to advocate with the college to improve the Academic Appeals process for students and faculty. In the last year, our efforts have resulted in several positive changes, such as:

- Centralizing the formal appeals process through the registrar to reduce the burden on students and automatically move the process along after meeting deadlines.
 - This has also allowed Conestoga College to track and identify any systemic issues with the appeals process.
- Increase student and faculty awareness of the appeals process by creating educational resources, including additional information to the Conestoga 101 course, and ensuring the appeals policies and procedures documents clearly define each parties' roles and responsibilities.
- CSI consulted with Conestoga College to ensure that updates made to the appeals process were beneficial and in the best interest of students.



2023 CSI Year-End Survey

CSI's Year-End Survey received over 3,000 responses from students, with an almost 8% student turnout!

This year's survey featured updated questions based on research best practices and included more intersectional analysis. We looked at how gender, dis/ability, and international vs. domestic students felt on all issues.

CSI gave out \$15,000 in prizes to students who completed the survey, including a grand prize of free tuition!

Health Care Coverage

Throughout the year, CSI's Wellness and Advocacy teams worked together with other student associations and community groups to explore areas to improve student health plans in the future including:

- Reducing barriers and improving coverage limits for Gender-affirming care
- Eliminating Pre-existing condition exemptions such as pregnancy and diabetes
- Reducing barriers to accessing and using the health plan

Advocacy Partnerships


Canadian Alliance of Student Associations

CSI's federal advocacy partner, the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA), successfully advocated for:

- Removal of GST on Building of New Student Residences
- Extension of the Apartment Loan Construction Program to include student housing
- Modernization of Shelter Calculations for Student Aid
- Extension of Canada Student Grants from \$3,000 to \$4,200 for 2024-2025
- Extension of Canada Student Loans from \$210 to \$300 per week
- Eligibility Improvements to the Canada Learning Bond

- The Permanent Elimination of Credit Screening Requirements for Mature Students
- Investment of \$242.7 million over 3 years for Indigenous students through the Post-Secondary Student Support Fund
- Investment of \$825 million over 5 years for Masters, Doctoral, and Research Scholarships
- Investment of \$1.8 billion in Research
 Funding for SSHRC, NSERC, and CIHR

Ontario Student Voices

Ontario Student Voices (OSV) completed its first full year of operations and started laying the groundwork to become a strong advocacy organization for Ontario college students. This included:

- Advocating for improvements related to the number of hours an international student can work, the impact of the introduction of an international student enrollment cap, and other changes related to the International Student Program.
- Engaging in targeted lobbying efforts with stakeholders, emphasizing key advocacy priorities such as international student support, food insecurity, housing, mental health, the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), and student debt.
- Developing and maintaining robust relationships with key stakeholders in the post-secondary education sector, notably Colleges Ontario, CASA, and the Ministry of Colleges and Universities.



- Cultivating professional relationships with over ten Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs), encompassing representatives from the Conservative Party, New Democratic Party (NDP), Green Party, and Liberal Party.
- Instituting foundational processes, including a comprehensive Guiding Advocacy research framework and strategic government relations approaches.
- Introducing Advocacy Scholarships, designed to be awarded to students in Ontario, with a Conestoga student being the first successful recipient.

At the start of each semester, CSI runs this campaign at the Reuter, Doon, and Milton campuses and encourages students to experience the CSI food service outlets and try out a menu item.



The Venue Take Out Window

In September 2023, CSI opened The Venue Takeout Window to provide students with affordable food options outside regular restaurant hours.

Operating Monday to Friday from 4 PM – 8 PM, The Venue Takeout Window offers The Venue menu classics, ice cream, and best of all, our new Tractor Beverages!

Free Baskets of Fries

In the Fall 2023 and Winter 2024 semesters, we gave out 260 free baskets of fries.



Stamp & Sip

This Winter, we introduced Stamp & Sip cards and promoted CSI's signature coffee blend, Flight of The Condor, which is roasted locally at Baden Coffee Company and served at all CSI food service locations. By showing the Stamp & Sip card at any one of CSI's food services outlets, students receive a stamp for their coffee purchase. Once they reach nine stamps, their tenth coffee is free! While this is available at all CSI outlets, we continuously see the fastest-growing popularity at The Reuter Market. With coffee as one of their best-sellers, Stamp & Sip aligns with Reuter students while rewarding them at the same time.

The Food Truck Grand Opening

Back in Spring 2023, The Food Truck made its official week-long Grand Opening tour across multiple Conestoga campuses. Featuring Truckin' Delicious eats, free poutines, games, and live music, this event served up the most scrumptious 'welcome to the family' for The Food Truck into the Conestoga Community.



Introducing the Parkhill Café

CSI opened the newest addition to its Food Service family in the Winter 2024 term – The Parkhill Café on Milton Campus. Students were introduced to the Parkhill Cafe through social media and in person, giving them the opportunity to explore the space, play some games, enjoy delicious cupcakes, listen to live music, and best of all, snag some fun Parkhill Café swag.

Pita Pit Customer Appreciation Day

Wrapping over 128 free pitas for customers, Pita Pit Customer Appreciation Day was a success and this day of thanks featured live music, cake and games. CSI was also able to share information about current Pita Pit offers, savings options like the MORE program, online ordering, and catering opportunities.






Collab Weeks

Leadership

Leadership Symposium:

Taking place in Fall of 2023, CSI hosted a Leadership Symposium with focus on Sustainability and Environmental Leadership. This symposium was in partnership with Professor Dr. Rajul Singh from the Conestoga College School of Business, and 36 student attendees heard from professors at the Conestoga College School of Business, and alumni in leadership positions within the sustainability field.

CSI's 10th Annual Leadership Conference

The 10th Annual Leadership Conference took place in Winter 2024 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel – Downtown Kitchener, focusing on Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI). This full-day conference featured top researchers and leaders in the field of EDI with speakers from York University, University of Waterloo, Carleton University, Conestoga College, Camino Wellbeing, and KW Community Justice Initiatives. Students, including some CSI part-time team and our clubs' executives, also presented research papers to conference delegates. Throughout the conference, 173 attendees connected with peers and leaders for a day of learning, reflecting, and discussing current topics and trends in leadership and EDI.

Leadership Workshops

During the year of 2023-2024 we hosted monthly Leadership Workshops each semester on topics ranging from emotional intelligence to accessibility and cyber security. These workshops were hosted on different campuses with an average of 30 students attending each workshop.

The CSI Awards Banquet

This Starry Night Awards Banquet took place in Winter 2024 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Downtown Kitchener. The stunning evening event included dinner and an awards ceremony, along with certificate distribution to our Board of Directors, CSI part-time staff, scholarship recipients, and clubs' executives, recognizing and appreciating their efforts and involvement within the college community.

Reintroducing Societies

This year, we saw the resurgence of our societies program. We reinstated a former society (CES) and finalized two new societies. Currently, CSI has three active societies: CES (Conestoga Engineering Society (CES), Health Information Association of Conestoga (HIAC), and Nursing.

Wellness

From mental health to physiotherapy (plus everything in between) we're focused on your well-being so YOU can focus on your academic journey.



The Student Nutrition Access Program

This year, our team shifted focus toward enhancing the Student Nutrition Access Program (better known as SNAP), to ensure each student has quick and convenient access to food security resources.

A few of the most notable outcomes for the year were:

- The Affordable Produce Program saw 6,749 students at our Free Market events on campus
- The Nourish and Go program provided students with snacks 253,114 times
- CSI's Emergency Food Funding provided 9,591
 Conestoga students with emergency food support



Free Affordable Produce Markets




The Social Media Impact
